# Bison Exhibit at the Grist Mill

Visitors will have the chance to take a closer look into the world of the American Bison (*Bison bison*). Learn more about the important role bison played economically, culturally, and ecologically, both in the past and the present. Touch a real bison hide and go eye-to-eye with a bison skeleton. View bison up-close through art and photographs. Discover how the Native Americans have used every part of the bison from food and clothes to instruments and tools.

## **Two Big Accomplishments**

The Franklin Creek State Natural Area (SNA) expanded by 40 acres when the FGC&PC sold the Hurd property on Old Mill Road to the Illinois Department of Natural Resources. This high quality woodland will be added to the Nature Preserve at the SNA. It is covered with beautiful wild flowers and provides

a great viewing point for two important geological features — Lovers Leap and Steamboat Rock.

And, the adjacent 22.8 acre Kelly property was purchased by the FGC&PC to protect and sell to the State when funds are available.

#### **Headwater Happenings**

A Stewardship Grant from the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation has provided \$30,000 to create and begin implementing a restoration plan for the 80-acre Headwaters Property owned by the FGC&PC. Watch for improvements to the upland woods and the wetlands and prairie areas in the coming months.

The Headwaters is adjacent to the Village of Franklin Grove and will



eventually serve as a link between the Village and the State Natural Area. This is a matching grant and requires both

Historic and contemporary topics are presented at the Chautauqua by speakers and performers with a variety of perspectives on culture, art, history, innovation, philosophy, and nature. The Chautauqua experience is both thought provoking and entertaining at the same time.

This year at the Chautauqua at Franklin Creek, history, culture, and art will abound. Visitors of all ages are invited to meet characters who step out of the pages of history to regale us with the stories of Abraham Lincoln's life and times. #### FEATURED RECIPE

#### **Lime & Cornmeal Cookies**

Prep time: 12 minutes Inactive time: 90 minutes Cook time: 17 minutes Yield: 12-14 cookies



#### Cookies:

- 1/2 stick unsalted butter, room temperature
- 1 cup sugar
- Zest of 3 large limes
- 1 egg, room temperature
- 3 tablespoons of lime juice (zest the limes first, then use the juice from 2-3 limes to get the 3Tb of juice)
- 1/2 teaspoon of pure vanilla extract
- 1 1/2 cups rice flour for cookies and a bit more for dusting
- 1/2 cup CORNMEAL
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon fine sea salt

#### Glaze:

- 1 1/3 cups powdered sugar
- Zest of 2 large limes
- 3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice

#### Cookies

- 1. Line baking sheet with parchment or silicone pad and set aside.
- 2. Using a food processor plus together the butter, sugar, and lime zest until combined. Add the egg, lime juice and vanilla and continue to process until smooth. Add the rice flour, cornmeal, baking powder, and salt. Continue processing until a ball of dough forms.
- 3. Place the dough on a lightly rice floured surface and knead for 20 seconds. Form into a ball and cover in plastic wrap and refrigerate for 20 minutes.
- 4. Preheat oven to 350 degrees and place rack in the center of the
- 5. On a lightly rice floured surface, using half of the ball of dough at a time, roll each half into approximately a 9" circle. Roll to 1/4" thickness. Dip the cutter lightly into the rice flour every few cookies to prevent sticking. Place cookies on the prepared baking sheet.
- Bake until light golden brown around the edges. Approximately 15-20 minutes. Cool on baking sheet for 10 minutes and then transfer to baking rack and cool an additional 15 minutes or until completely cool.

#### Glaze:

Whisk together powdered sugar, lime zest, and lemon juice until smooth. Spread each cookie with about 1 teaspoon of glaze, leaving a bit of edge around the cookie. Allow the glaze to harden for about 45 minutes before serving.

This is a super gluten free cookie. If you substitute all purpose flour for the rice flour you will need to INCREASE the all purpose flour from 1/3 cup to 3/4 cup.
