Stewardship at Franklin Creek

Land conservation can no longer only mean setting aside land for wildlife. Conservation requires us to steward the land to remove invasive species and rebuild ecosystems that have degraded without management. This year alone, our incredible volunteers have donated over 550 active stewardship hours to restoring our lands. With the help of some incredible contractors, we have worked to remove invasive honeysuckle, sweet clover, non-native grasses, and multiflora rose along with collecting trash and removing fencing that hinders animal movement. Fire was reintroduced to areas that hadn't experienced fire's natural effects in many decades. With the invasive species reduced and the habitat structure headed in the right direction, native plants need to be seeded. Thus far we have also collected 65 locally sourced plant species to spread to our restored areas with many more species to come! Thank you to all of our volunteers and partners for their phenomenal efforts!

Bio Blitz

"Bio" means life and "Blitz" means to do something quickly and intensively. Together they make for a collaborative team competi-I tion to discover and inventory as many species of flora and fauna as possible in a set location. The purpose of a BioBlitz is to set restoration goals and monitor ecological I changes over time. Franklin Creek Conservation Association hosted a BioBlitz on Saturday (9/8/2018) which began with some educational presentations on how to identify local plants. Then, out in the field, we were able to monitor a restored prairie, a restored wetland, a woodland currently undergoing restoration, along with some CRP crop field borders. We had 17 people participating ranging from beginners to incredibly knowledgeable people. With the help of volunteers, we were able to use trap cameras, minnow traps, and a seine net to add mammals and aquatic spe-cies! Together, we were able to identify 152 plant species, 12 butterflies and moths, 11 birds, 9 mammals, 4 fish, and others!
